

INFORMATION-

LIBRARY CARDS

Many Patrons will agree that their library card is one of the most important in their wallet. Getting a card is easy. Simply present a photo I.D. and proof of address. People living within the Salem city limits pay for library privileges through real estate and personal property taxes. So, there is no charge to signup. Because folks living outside the city limits do not pay these taxes, they pay the library directly for the same privileges. The cost is \$25.00 for a six month membership or \$50.00 for an annual membership.

We also want to stress that anyone is allowed to use the library. The only reason you need a library card is to check out items. Even if you do not have a card, you are more than welcome to visit the library; find a place to read a book off the shelves; participate in programs; and so much more! There is also a paperback trade program where you can bring in pocket-sized paperbacks and exchange them for select pocket-sized paperbacks in our sale room. There is also always a 50¢ book sale. Discarded magazines are available and are free to take.

MISSOURI EVERGREEN



Salem Public Library is part of the Missouri Evergreen consortium. This means that we share resources with over 50 other libraries throughout the state. So, if there is something that you wish to read,

watch, or listen to that is not part of Salem's collection, odds are that it can be borrowed from one of these other libraries. A request, or hold, may be placed for that item. It is then delivered to Salem Public Library via courier at no cost to you. You may be called, texted, or emailed when the item is available for circulation.



The Libby app is the easiest way to get started with digital books, audiobooks, and magazines from your public library!

- Install the Libby app from the app store on your Android or IOS (iPhone/iPad/iPod touch) device. Or, visit libbyapp.com in your Chrome, Firefox, Safari, or Edge browser.
- In Libby, follow the prompts to find your library and sign in with a valid card number.
- Browse your library's collection and borrow a title.
- Borrowed titles appear on your *Shelf* and download to the app automatically when you're on WI-FI, so you can read them when you're offline.
 - Tap Read With... to choose whether you'd like to open a book in Kindle or Libby.
 - Tap Open In Libby, Open Magazine, or Open Audiobook to start reading or listening in the app.
 - Tap Manage Loan to see options like Renew and Return.

REVIEW

JULY BOOK REVIEW

July is a hot, busy month in the Ozarks. It's full moon has several names. One is buck moon as male deer are growing their antlers. Settlers called it the hay moon. Summer weather brings the thunderstorms, so it is also the thunder moon.

Thunderstorms do appear in various books, but only as events. This month I read "Rain Reign", a juvenile book, in which a hurricane is an important event. What sets this book apart is the narrator, a twelve-year-old girl diagnosed with high-functioning autism. She has obsessions: homonyms and prime numbers most of all.

Since the book is written in first person, it looks at the world from Rose's view point with her obcessions and difficulties relating to other people taking center stage for a time until it seems normal? Her dog Rain (Reign, Rein – a triple homonym) gets let out during the hurricane by her father and disappears. Rose depends on routines, following the rules. Now the rules change as she hunts for her dog.

Many picture books take a look at thunderstorms. A recently read good one is "Storm in the Night" with a thunderstorm knocking out the electricity for a grandfather and grandson. "Rumble, Boom!" is about thunderstorms, a picture book for older children.
