GO FISHING WITH YOUR LIBRARY CARD



Trout season opened March 1st! Salem Public Library and the Missouri Department of Conservation are partners in the Rod and Reel Loaner Program. Through the Rod & Reel Loaner Program individuals can check out fishing poles and tackle boxes for free using their library cards at the Salem Public Library. The fishing poles are equipped with standard spin-cast reels. The tackle boxes are supplied with hooks, sinkers, rubber worms, and bobbers for basic fishing opportunities.

Individuals need to provide their own live bait or desired lures to bait the hook. Equipment checks out for 3 days. Fishing rods and tackle boxes need to be returned to the circulation desk, not the drop box. Items may not be renewed and are subject to overdue fines.

ACTIVITIES

LIBRARY CARDS

Many Patrons will agree that their library card is one of the most important in their wallet. Getting a card is easy. Simply present a photo I.D. and proof of address. People living within the Salem city limits pay for library privileges through real estate and personal property taxes. So, there is no charge to signup. Because folks living outside the city limits do not pay these taxes, they pay the library directly for the same privileges. The cost is \$25.00 for a six month membership or \$50.00 for an annual membership.

We also want to stress that anyone is allowed to use the library. The only reason you need a library card is to check out items. Even if you do not have a card, you are more than welcome to visit the library; find a place to read a book off the shelves; participate in programs; and so much more! There is also a paperback trade program where you can bring in pocket-sized paperbacks and exchange them for select pocket-sized paperbacks in our sale room. There is also always a 50¢ book sale. Discarded magazines are available and are free to take.

MISSOURI EVERGREEN



Salem Public Library is part of the Missouri Evergreen consortium. This means that we share resources with over 50 other libraries throughout the state. So, if there is something that you wish to read,

watch, or listen to that is not part of Salem's collection, odds are that it can be borrowed from one of these other libraries. A request, or hold, may be placed for that item. It is then delivered to Salem Public Library via courier at no cost to you. You may be called, texted, or emailed when the item is available for circulation.



The Libby app is the easiest way to get started with digital books, audiobooks, and magazines from your public library!

- Install the Libby app from the app store on your Android or IOS (iPhone/iPad/iPod touch) device. Or, visit libbyapp.com in your Chrome, Firefox, Safari, or Edge browser.
- In Libby, follow the prompts to find your library and sign in with a valid card number.
- Browse your library's collection and borrow a title.
- Borrowed titles appear on your *Shelf* and download to the app automatically when you're on WI-FI, so you can read them when you're offline.
 - Tap Read With... to choose whether you'd like to open a book in Kindle or Libby.
 - Tap Open In Libby, Open Magazine, or Open Audiobook to start reading or listening in the app.
 - Tap Manage Loan to see options like Renew and Return.

SUMMER READING PROGRAM

EXCITING NEWS

Salem Public Library has been awarded a grant of \$11,490.00! We're calling this project Tech Revival because it will allow us to further upgrade library technology, improving services to our community. Through the grant, eleven new computers and eleven new monitors, as well as two new barcode scanners, fifteen licenses of Microsoft Office software, and three licenses of Deep Freeze software will be purchased.

Seven of the computers and monitors will replace outdated equipment in the public-use computer area. Three of the computers and monitors will replace failing equipment at the library catalog stations. One computer and monitor along with one barcode scanner will be upgrades at the circulation desk. The second barcode scanner will replace one that no longer functions in the cataloger's office.

Additionally, Friends of the Salem Public Library has generously provided local funds, making it possible to purchase a new circulation desk receipt printer as well hire local IT services for installation during Tech Revival.

Stay tuned for Tech Revival updates as the new equipment is installed and ready for use!

REVIEW

JUNE BOOK REVIEW

June means summer has arrived along with vacations. Every year I see lists of recommended beach read books, but have never read one. This year I decided to find out what many people consider a good beach read book.

Since I've never read a beach read book before, I asked the librarians to steer me in the right direction. My pick was "Beautiful Day" by Elin Hilderbrand. It was about a wedding, something June is often the month for, held on Nantucket Island. The time frame was four days and a lot got packed into that four days. All of the main characters had very complicated lives and relationships. The backbone of the story was the Notebook written by the bride's mother before her death seven years detailing her youngest daughter's wedding.

Each main chapter was begun with an entry from the Notebook. Different characters were the main focus of the various chapters. Still, the book was easy to follow and kept my interest all the way to the ending, a happy one of course.

More in line with my usual reading fare was "Gift From the Sea" by Anne Morrow Lindbergh. This is a nonfiction pick and much more introspective.

Each section revolves around a shell from the shore of the beach where the author was staying for a few weeks vacation. She stayed alone giving her time to reflect on her busy life without the myriad items most women must pack into their lives.

As the author writes, women are often the hub around which the lives of husbands, children and family revolve. Somehow they must keep all of these various people in balance. Yet the constant demands on them take a serious toll.

Using various shells, a whelk, a sunrise clam, an oyster and others, the author reflects on various times within a woman's life and the relationships of that time. Each chapter invites the reader to take a serious look at their own life and how to make it better.
